Message from the State Deputy

“Happy New Year”

As we enter the second half of the fraternal year we need to evaluate where our Councils stand in regards to Membership and Programs. I have confidence in you that we will do a better job in all aspects of the order.

Supreme has lifted the memorization clause in the first degree. It is no longer necessary to totally memorize the entire part but you must do it with meaning. There should be no excuse for a candidate to have to wait to become a Knight in our Order. Remember all you have to do is ask.

I have received calls regarding the amount a Financial Secretary is allowed to charge a Honorary Member. The annual payment for Honorary Members will include the Supreme per capita charges (\$3.50), the Catholic Advertising (\$1.00), and the amount of the State Council per capita charge (\$7.00). In Wisconsin the amount that should be charged is \$11.50. Please note that Honorary Members are exempt from the Culture of Life Assessments. You may ask for a voluntary contribution for the Penny a Knight a Day (\$3.50), Wisconsin Respect for Life (\$3.50) and the Supreme Culture of Life Funds (\$2.00) but remember these are not mandatory.

Financial Audit

Supreme Council has an established a standard that all State Councils must file annual financial report accompanied by either and an independent accountant review or independent auditor report. The latter one is required if a State Council's assets or revenues equals or exceeds \$500,000. Wisconsin State Council's combined general (unrestricted) and special revenue (restricted) funds exceed that threshold amount. Thus, the State Council is required to comply with Supreme Council's audit guideline to submit an independent auditor's report with its annual financial statements. The fiscal year reporting covers July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

The State Council has retained a certified public accountant, Clifford Wiernik, Stevens Point to conduct its first annual financial audit. Mr. Wiernik will apply tests and methods to assure him of fairly presented amounts provided in State Council ledger accounts for producing its financial statements. One of his methods is to confirm a sample selection of council's invoiced and paid per capita amounts to the State Council. The selected council financial secretary will receive a request to confirm semi-annual per capita charges invoiced from and paid to the State

Council. Upon receipt of that confirmation request, the financial secretary is asked to respond to it promptly. There may be other such requests for information regarding collection, receipting and remittance of donations for each of the special revenue funds-Intellectually Disabled Charity, Pro Life and Life Savers for Life. The state officers ask committee directors of each of these funds to also cooperate promptly with auditor requests.

The State Council is currently delinquent in filing its financial report with Supreme this year due to this new requirement. So, it is important that council officers and committee directors that may become involved in these audit procedures provide prompt attention to the auditor requests. The goal is to complete this audit and file the necessary reports with Supreme no later than mid-February.

Thank for you cooperation on this matter. Being an annual process going forward, this process will begin during the fall months next year for completion no later than December 2011.

This is a time sensitive request as the deadline for having the District wide orders to Chuck Simmons is February 15, 2011. This gives ample time to sort the orders and get shipping arrangements made for the Tootsie Rolls to be delivered by Mid March. When ordering the Tootsie Rolls do not forget to look and see if your aprons are up to date and are in good repair. The apron need to have the slogan "Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities".

From the Desk of the State Advocate

Dear Brother Knights,
Here is how Webster's dictionary defines advocate.

1: one that pleads the cause of another; *specifically* : one that pleads the cause of another before a [tribunal](#) or judicial court

2: one that defends or maintains a cause or proposal

3: one that supports or promotes the interests of another

At this time of year those definitions shape much of what my responsibilities are to you. But there is a catch. I can only be an effective advocate for you if you submit your resolutions by the deadline and if you ask me to review them for proper form. If you do I will help you to craft them to clearly reflect what you want and to put them into the most effective form that I can.

After that, my role becomes one of impartially administering a process, so I will not be able to champion your cause. You will need to prepare to do that through the delegates to the

convention. I can and will tell you the rules of debate so that you can effectively prepare.

But that comes later. For now, you simply need to drop me a line with your best shot at your resolution before the deadline.

What is the deadline?

Article III, Section 6 of our Bylaws puts the deadline to have the resolution to the Resolution Committee two weeks prior to the meeting of the Resolutions Committee. This year that meeting is set for March 12, which makes your deadline February 1 to allow for printing and distribution of the resolutions to the committee in be time.

Who may submit a resolution?

Article III, Section 6 of our Bylaws states that they "may only e submitted by a Subordinate Council, the State Deputy, the State Officers as a group, and by Standing State Committees" provided, in the latter case, that the resolution is "germane to the work of the committee."

Wishing you a Blessed and Prosperous New Year

As we enter the New Year we must remain mindful that the Fourth Degree principal of Patriotism is love of our Country, Church, and our Order. However, we need to practice all four principals of the order; Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism and our actions will be most worthy and pleasing to our God. As Sir Knights we belong to the most visible and most prestigious degree of the order. Our public image is how other people judge the Knights of Columbus and our Catholic Church. Here are a few suggestions on how to dress it up.

1. March through corners - - Do not hesitate or stop.
2. Know the difference between the "Domino Effect" and the regular "Group Salute" while saluting the cross and clergy.
3. At "Carry Sword" the sword blade should be perpendicular to the shoulders.
4. Council and Assembly jewels can be worn at the discretion of the Commander or Marshal.
5. Silence is the rule while at attention unless directed by the Commander.
6. Return sword command should not be executed while walking.
7. No wing tip collar shirts should be worn, only regular lay down collars. Also, no vests should be worn.
8. Replace outdated and/or faded capes, baldrics, chapeaus, and gloves. Capes should be pressed; shoes should be clean and polished (BLACK SHOES ONLY).
9. The combination, American Flag/Lapel (New Pin) should be placed near the button hole. No other pins are allowed on either lapel.
10. No gloves or chapeau should be worn or carried at communion.

This list was compiled by SK Michael Jordan, Marshal of Eastern Wisconsin District. When in doubt, reference the Color Corps Manual or ask the District Marshal or Master for their interpretation.

The Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity forms are due by January 31, 2011. If you file this electronically make sure that you send a copy to the Vice Supreme Master, Master, and a copy for your assembly records. It may be a good idea to send on to the Area coordinator so he's aware of what goes on in his area. They don't automatically go to those other recipients as directed on the bottom of the form. This is form #1728.

FYI:

SHOULD I SALUTE OR PLACE MY HAND OVER MY HEART?
Public Law 110-181 states "all persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove the headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries present should stand at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes." To clarify, retirees may salute or place their hand over their heart to render respect to the United States of America flag.

Knowledge Contest Reminders

The countdown to the State Contest at Assumption H.S. in Wisconsin Rapids began January 1st. Participating councils should have completed their Math and/or Spelling Contests by **February 15th** and have submitted their **First Place winners** and the **number of participants at each grade level** to their **Diocesan Coordinator promptly!**

1. "Double" winners in Math, Spelling or Free Throw Shooting must choose ONE event at the Diocesan level.
2. Winners advancing to the Diocesan Contest must be given a TRAVEL CARD to be shown at the registration table and to be used to gain admission to the contest room. The cards are to be collected after the contestants have filled out the cover page of the contest booklet.
3. Efforts should be made to send **an alternate** (the 2nd Place winner) if the 1st Place winner opts out of the Diocesan Contest.

The **place, date and times of all Diocesan Contests** must be made known to all participating councils so that NO eligible contestants miss their opportunity to compete!

Diocesan Coordinators – your Diocesan Contests must be held by **March 15, 2010**.

1. First and Second Place winners at the Diocesan Level are eligible for ONE event at the State Contest on **Saturday, March 27, 2010**.
2. Each contestant must have a specific TRAVEL CARD with them when they register for the State Contest.
3. Diocesan Coordinators must make sure that their winners have enough time to make arrangements for the State Contest.
4. Arrange for alternates if necessary and in a timely manner.

Please do me the courtesy of submitting your winners' names NO later than March 22, 2010. By all means use E-mail if you prefer to use a spread sheet instead of the Report Forms. With everyone's cooperation this State Council Youth Program will be a success. Your efforts in this educational endeavor are sincerely appreciated.

The Partnership Profile Report with Special Olympics, Form 4584, is found in the forms book and due by Jan 31, 2011. All Councils should file this report with Supreme. It asks for volunteer hours, number of volunteers, and contributions. I am sure that every council could report at least \$1.00 per member donated each year. Members give to Special Olympics many different ways, polar plunge, torch run, raffles, local fundraiser, etc. which should be included in donations. This report is what Supreme uses to determine the size of grant that we receive each year. This grant is given to Special Olympics Wisconsin at our state convention. For the year 2009 councils reported over \$54,000.00 donated, a very good figure. Let us see if we cannot get well over that amount for 2010. REMEMBER TO REPORT THIS AMOUNT ON THE FRATERNAL ACTIVITIES SURVEY ALSO.

A special Thank You to all councils and assemblies who donated to the Team Wisconsin drive this last year. We were able to raise \$20,000.00 to help offset the costs of sending the team to the National games. Our goal for Team Wisconsin 2014 is \$100,000.00 to cover the costs. We have 4 years to raise this amount. If we figure by membership this amounts to \$.75 per member per year, a small figure. Please do not wait till 2014 to donate to this cause.

Grand Knights and District Deputies, the time is getting near to submit the Family of the Year Nominations for your councils.

We would like the nominations to be submitted by the first of February, however the absolute deadline is Feb. 15, 2011.

District Deputies. Please check with your councils to see that they are working on their nominations and that they are providing all the necessary information on their families. Last year we had councils

submit nominations of families that the committee knew were very deserving families, but the council did not document what their family did. They did not have any pictures of the family or any letters of recommendation from the family's pastor and other community leaders. We have to judge the nominations according to the information provided.

Last year we had numerous nominations that were only 1 or 2 pages.

You can tell your councils that they can resubmit nominations that were sent last year if they want to enhance them with more information.

They should not hesitate to get the family involved in preparing the nomination, but they should not just hand the form to the family and tell them to fill it out. It is the council's responsibility to prepare the nomination.

A good nomination should be about the size of a medium sized photo album, containing pictures of the members of the family involved with activities in the area of Church, Council, Community, Youth and Family. We are looking for families that work together and pray together.

The nomination should include a photo of the family that could be used in the convention booklet.

The photo submitted should be a good quality reproduction. Do not send studio photos because if the family is chosen to be the Family of the Year, their nomination is sent on to Supreme. Supreme does not return the materials to us.

Shortly after Feb 15, the Family Committee will meet to evaluate the nominations.

One Family will be chosen from each Diocese to be the Diocesan Family of the Year. From those five Diocesan Families of the Year, one family will be chosen to be the Wisconsin State Council's State Family of the Year.

The five families chosen will be personally notified and invited to attend the State Deputy's Banquet at the State Convention, to receive their award.

The State Family of the Year will be announced at the banquet. The 5 Diocesan Families of the year receive 2 Banquet tickets and one nights lodging.

Expenses for the State Family of the Year will be paid for, by the State office. The expenses for the other four families, will be invoiced to their home council by the State Office.

When a council submits a nomination, they should identify a contact person and phone number in case we need to contact someone for more information or clarification.

The Family of the Year Nominations should be sent directly to me.

Worthy State Deputies,

I wanted to send a quick note wishing all of you a happy and holy new year and my prayers that you and your family had a very blessed and joyous Christmas.

As we enter into the second half of this fraternal year and most winter meetings are complete, I wanted to share with you a couple of thoughts.

If you remember at our midyear meeting in November, we discussed why membership in our Order is important not only to us as a viable organization but to the Catholic Church as a whole. More important than any one of us individually, membership in our Order is evangelical in that it engages many of our members to do more in their communities, churches, and often their own families. Simultaneously, our evangelical charity also provides a living example of Catholic men in action living their faith through prayer and works of mercy, which in itself evangelizes lukewarm Catholics and often men from other denominations to strive to be like us.

In my short time here and after visiting just a few states, I am finding that our men are hungry for a positive outlook on membership and a reason to ask other men to join us. We have always believed that every catholic man should be offered an opportunity to join us, but what reason have we given him to join? Do we have solid programs at the council level that he can get involved in? Are our councils accomplishing good works formed in faith? Do we have a spiritual based council that supports parish life or are we the social committee for the parish or community? What is the image of our local K of C councils? The Supreme Knight has stated that our councils should be the lead organization within the parish for charitable outreach. Providing this outreach is where you will find fertile grounds for recruitment.

I believe and many of your men believe that we should be asking men to join the Order in an attempt to engage them in their faith. We are a unique organization in that we are bound in Unity through the Eucharist. I am convinced that our patron, the Venerable Fr. Michael J. McGivney, watches over and prays for us daily. More and more men are attending diocesan men's retreats, our college men are better formed, seminary enrollment has been on the rise, and our teenagers are looking for spiritual outreach. The opportunity for the Order to grow has never been greater than now.

I have often used the Supreme Knight's words which hold very special meaning for me: "IF NOT US THEN WHO?" This statement applies to us across the board. If we do not stand up for those who cannot defend themselves (babies, handicapped, intellectually challenged, aged) then who will. When the Church and our priests come under attack, who is there to defend them? In order to accomplish this, we must stand up for ourselves and grow. The message needs to resonate at the council level which means your stateboards need to follow-up with District Deputies to ensure that this is our message.

Our Districts should have a growth plan for the next five months:

- Every Council Active
- New First Degree Pilot -- Allowed to read the degree - Every council should try it --especially if they have never done one
- Every Council to hold a degree a month through the end of the year
- Encouraging councils to strive for Star Council
- Districts should plan their way to Star District
- Work with Field Agents to plan goals for next five months
